## **Good News**

The following "Good News" items were shared:

- The elementary library was recently awarded the 2016-17 STEM Scale-Up grant for the Science Center of Iowa's Making STEM Connections program. This program provides an extensive kit that includes tools, supplies, teacher resources and lessons that are designed to inspire children to become "Makers" through the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math) principles and 21st Century skills.
- Recently a recreational soccer team affiliated with Dowling played a game on Panorama's turf field. The coaches were very
  impressed with the field and facility and the ability for their kids to play soccer under the lights, which was something they had
  never experienced before. They also commented how great it was that the school would be so supportive of the local club,
  knowing that Panorama doesn't have a high school team. They both said it was one of the best places they have played, and
  the final comment from one coach was: "I'd pay money to be able to play on a field like this every week."
- A new student activity club is being formed at Panorama Schools called the Panorama Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA).
   FCA is a student led organization and will focus on equipping, enabling, empowering and encouraging students to impact and influence their school for Christ. This group will be completely voluntary and will function the same as other student organizations; with activities taking place before or after school.
- The recent Glow Bike, Run, Walk that was held on October 2<sup>nd</sup> to kick off Homecoming week was very successful with approximately 70 participants.
- Panorama has been selected to be featured on Channel 5 "Blitz Game Day" on Friday, Oct. 14. Local 5 news station will be
  doing a live broadcast from the Panorama football stadium from 6:00-7:00 AM. All fans, students (K-12), teachers, and
  community members are asked to be there at 5:45 AM.

## Reports

## Spanish Club

Spanish teacher Michael Geneser requested approval for the Spanish Club to travel to Cube for a 9-day trip in June 2017. This trip will cost each student \$3894.00 and will include visits to Havana, Trinidad and Vinales. The board will make a final decision at the November regular meeting.

# Math Curriculum

Secondary teachers Robyn Ploeger, Jenelle Jarnagin and Greg Thompson were present to discuss Carneige, the math curriculum the district has been using the past 5 years. The biggest frustration for students and parents is not the actual Carneige curriculum, but rather the software program that is used (Cognitive Tutor & Mathia). The teachers recommended the district continue using the Carneige curriculum, but to explore other purchasing options with the software so it may be used for a targeted student population.

# Liz Ratcliff, Elementary Principal

- Wednesday morning PD has been spent identifying specific math skills that are essential for each grade level.
- There is a full day of PD planned on October 28th, in which teachers will review the Common Core book for literacy and math as well as complete math assessment work.
- Staff at the elementary continue to focus on PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention & Support).
- The SINA (Schools in Need of Assistance) committee will meet to review standards and academic needs.

## Thad Stanley, MS/HS Principal

- Teachers continue to work on customized learning plans during Wednesday morning professional development. In addition, teachers are working on long term goals of professional development.
- Teachers are preparing for the new state assessment in order to better prepare students to take the test.
- TLC coaches are working to assist teachers on how to put the lowa Standards into action and to develop strategies for sharing tools and resources.
- The district continues to be proactive with the bullying and harassment initiative which included a student assembly with a
  guest speaker from the FBI who talked with students about the ramifications of cyberbullying and other issues with social
  media use.

# **Shawn Holloway, Superintendent**

- A meeting with the SIAC committee was held on Tuesday, October 4<sup>th</sup> which focused on creating a core vision and mission statement for the district, as well as reviewing recent student assessment results.
- The mediation process for the KUNOs lawsuit is scheduled to begin on October 18th, 2016.
- The record board for Panorama golf has been completed.
